Western Red Cedar (*Thuja Plicata*)

Native to the western regions of Northern California, Oregon, Washington, Canada, and Alaska, this wood presents a favorable substitute for redwood. Jackel obtains most of their Cedar from Vancouver Island, British Columbia. This old growth stock has unique properties that make it the mainstay of the big timber industry in the Western United States. It is exceptionally light in weight yet at the same time remarkably strong. It is straight grained and only moderately hard, which means that it can be worked to precise dimensions with a good surface finish. It is naturally durable and resists decay without any kind of preservative treatment.
